London, June 26.—In the House of Commons debate on clause 4 of the educational bill giving extended facilities for denominational teaching on a four-fifths vote, Edward Blake (Nationalist), strongly supported the appeal to make the clause mandatory. Catholics and other religious bodies, he said, demanded the definite right of specific religious teaching in school not at the caprice of any local authority, but on the mandate of Parliament itself.


