



A WONDERFUL LAMP.


How to Produce a Brilliant Light With Alcohol Vapor.


This lamp is not the famous lamp of Aladdin, which he had only to rub gently in order to bring about the most wonderful and extravagant doings in the world.

It is, however, a wonderful lamp, for It has power to produce an extraor-dinary light similar to that of a powerful incandescent electric globe, and that, too, without either smoke or any sort of disagreeable odor.

In fact, you might almost call it an incandescent lamp, only instead of an electric current you have alcohol vapor or gas.

First, you must be told that platinum is a metal that has the property of absorbing a great deal of gas or vapor. Very well. Now prepare your lamp thus: Take an ordinary chafing dish





WONDERFUL VAPOR LAMP. samp (alcohol lamp), fix up a strong wire arm over it, something like a fancy street lamp post or shop sign sup-port, and from this arm suspend a platinum wire which has been twisted into a spiral. Make sure that the wire hangs directly over the wick or the hole through which the flame rises, Now light the wick or alcohol, and

the flame will quickly shoot up platinum wire and make it red hot. In a few moments put out the flame. You will then discover the astonishing fact that the platinum wire, far from gradually cooling, will grow steadily hotter (the wick being warm enough to promote a continuous vaporization of the alcohol and the vapor being steadabsorbed by the platinum wire), and as soon as it turns to a pinkis white color it will begin to throw out an intense clear light, which will con tinue as long as the alcohol lasts.
This is an interesting experiment and worth your trying, boys and girls.—
