REPORT IS CONFIRMED

Civic Tax Rate for 1905 to be 22 Mills Which will Pay City's Way and Leave Small Surplus

Ald. Marshall Lauds the Maple City and Sees Nothing But Prosperity Ahead.

It has been pretty generally understood that the civic tax rate for 1905 would be 22 mills, so that those in attendance at last night's session of the City Council confidently looked forward to a confirmation of the rumor. They were not disappointed. Finance Minister Marshall named the much coveted rate and joy filled the hearts of all.

Ald. Marshall prefaced the introduction of his by-law with a few remarks, lauding the Maple City, its progressive citizens and its council. A few years ago the principal problem confronting the Board of Works was the hauling of dirt from one hole to another on the city streets. Pavements have done away with that. These are costly but pay for themselves in the impetus they give the city toward the exalted position it is assuming among Canadian cities.

The rate will pay the city's way and have a surplus of about \$2,500 for contingencies. Already part of this has been appropriated for the purpose of extending the water mains so as to afford fire protection to the General Hospital and The Pines.

Ald. Marshall entrusted the chairman of the different committees to keep within the estimates for their respective departments. In this connection the Mayor gave public notice of his intention to cancel the check for the first salaries were expected to be paid in order to prevent any deficit at the end of the year.

The expenditures of the different departments are about the same as last year, but the Board of Health had spent more and the new building had been erected at the cemetery. Of course the rate has been materially reduced by the contribution of \$17,000 to the city coffers from the Pere Marquette.

The division of the rate is as follows:
6 8-10 mills for general purposes.
4 9-10 mills for Public school purposes.

2 3-10 mills for Waterworks Department.
2 2-10 mills for Collegiate Institute
4 6-10 mills for consolidated debt service fund.

4-10 mills for Public Library purposes.
2-10 mills to pay interest on Dowsley and Chaplin loans.
3-10 mills Queen street paving debt service.

3-10 mills electric lighting.
