The "Little Jap" at the Herald office must have had an extra dose of that complaint, which is prevalent amongst animals, on Saturday.

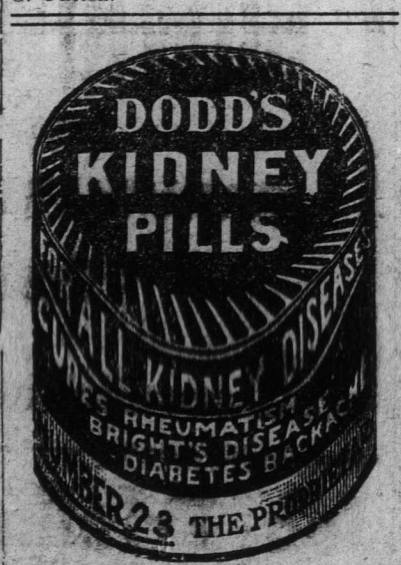

Directions for the Poll.

Each elector, on the day of the Poll, is required to declare his name, and to sign his name to the Poll Book.

After doing so he is to receive a Ballot Paper in which he is to write the name of the candidate for whom he intends to vote.

The voter is to vote in private, and his vote is to be kept secret.

After receiving his Ballot Paper, the voter shall go to the Polling Station, and there provided, place his Ballot Paper in the Ballot Box, and then leave the Polling Station.

If a voter inadvertently puts his Ballot Paper in the wrong box, he may return to the Polling Station, and if he is satisfied, he may return to the Polling Station, and if he is satisfied, he may return to the Polling Station.

If a voter takes a Ballot Paper out of the Polling Station, and fraudulently puts any Ballot Paper in the Polling Station, he shall be liable to a fine of Five Hundred Dollars, or imprisonment for six months, or both.
