Now our new Prime Minister gave us to understand during his political campaign that his Government would do as good for the Sailors and Soldiers of Newfoundland as any of the other colonies. Now is the time for him to put his words into action.

I know here are a great many people saying "Oh! the Government is doing great things for our returned men," but let me inform those people that any man who spent four years in the North Sea dodging German mines and torpedoes—not to mention the men who spent four years on the blood soaked fields of France—knows that \$420 is not enough to pay them for what they went through, and we must not forget that while we were undergoing those hardships the people before mentioned were at home in comfort receiving a fat salary, and were being handed out the sum of one dollar and ten cents per day.

Now if one of us returned men go to look for employment the first thing we are asked is, what experience have you had, and if the answer is none, we are told that we cannot be employed.

Now when we went to join up to save our country and protect those people who are refusing us employment to-day, we were not asked what experience we had, had; No, we were just handed down a rifle and bayonet, and told to use it, for your life and your country's freedom depend on it.

That's the way we got down to business in the Army and Navy, and I am certain that if some of our Sailors and Soldiers were handed down a yard stick in one of those dry goods stores, or a ham knife in a grocery store, he would use it as well as he did the bayonet, without having had the experience.

F. P. U. Convention.

The Eleventh Annual Convention of the Fishermen's Protective Union opened at Port Union last night, the first business on the order papers being the delivery of the customary address of the President. Catching Trade Pirates.

THINGS THAT USE FALSE TRADE MARKS.

There is a bitter complaint on the part of some of our manufacturers that knives and other metal goods imported from the United States bear the words "made in Sheffield."

Trade piracy is no new crime. In the days of Edward IV, the artificers grievously complained that they were greatly impoverished by the multitude of divers wares fetched and brought in beyond the seas, whereof the greater part in substance is counterfeit.

The kings in those days had sovereign powers, and Edward's response to the petitioners was to issue an edict forbidding the importation of all foreign manufactured goods.

Some time later a complaint was made to Parliament as to foreign wares falsely described as English. The Act was passed ordering all imported wares to be marked with the name and address of the foreign manufacturer.

It was not, however, until the year 1887 that the importation of all goods bearing the names of British manufacturers was prohibited. But this Act gave partial protection. Cutlery stamped "Joseph Rodgers & Sons, Sheffield," was barred, but "Best Sheffield Steel," could not be objected to. The Act of 1887 was better. Any person selling goods with false trade marks became liable to a year's imprisonment, with forfeiture of all the articles in question.

During the first three months after the Act was passed no fewer than one hundred and ten thousand packages containing goods falsely marked were seized by our Customs officers.

During the following year there were 220,000 detentions, of which the great majority came from Germany.
