WATER TO BE MUDDY FOR YET ANOTHER YEAR IN CITY

The survey camp of the waterworks department has moved on toward the mountains, having completed a survey of the Elbow river up to O'Haggarety's homestead, where they have located one possible site for a reservoir and dam, and have mapped out alternate courses to the city.

Two Squadrons of Dragoons
Will Receive King George
but the Tsar Will Get but
One; Papers Full of Amicable
Talk Towards Britain

Berlin, May 26.—The preparations for the wedding on Saturday next of Princess Victoria Louise, only daughter of the German Emperor, and Prince Ernest of Saxe-Coburg, are attracting a striking prominence to the emperor's apparent desire to make the occasion a demonstration of the friendship existing between Great Britain and the German empire.

Especially, the non-political character has been emphasized, but the real attitude of the emperor was illustrated by the fact that the emperor and empress, three English subjects who are now under various terms of imprisonment in Germany, will be present, and that the chief concern in the forthcoming visit of King George and Queen Mary is considered to be the opportunity of seeing this evening in the Nord Deutscher Allgemeine Zeitung, which prints in a prominent position the following account of the reception arrangements for the British sovereigns, and in a few lines mentions the fact that the emperor has preparations for the reception for Emperor Nicholas of Russia.

The German newspapers are giving attention to the political importance which the wedding ceremony have in bringing a manifestation of friendship between Germany and Great Britain, but they have little to say concerning a similar manifestation toward Russia.

Emperor William will spend a busy forenoon on May 22. He will make three journeys to the railroad station in the short two hours and a half which he will receive successively the Grand Duchess Louise of Baden, the Duke and Duchess of Cumberland and

The Russian emperor, who has made state entries into the city, each time through the main half miles of streets lined with thousands of crack guard troops, and their welcoming shouts and cheering, has been subjected to a number of changes of uniform on his part. Six times he has changed his uniform, and the representatives of several other German reigns have been present. The emperor has been in the course of the day making necessary arrangements more or less formal receptions.

A number of high British and Russian nobles have arrived in Berlin today to supervise arrangements for the safety of King George and Emperor Nicholas.

The German nobles are attracted to the emperor perhaps more attention than the emperor himself. They are endeavoring to elaborate installation of a system to ensure the security of the Russian emperor.

London, England, May 19.—The first collegiate magazine produced by girl undergraduates has been brought out at Manchester. The staff consists of a chief editor, news editor, sports editor, and four reporters.

Besides writing every word that will appear in the magazine, the girls will read and correct the proofs and superintend the "make-up."
