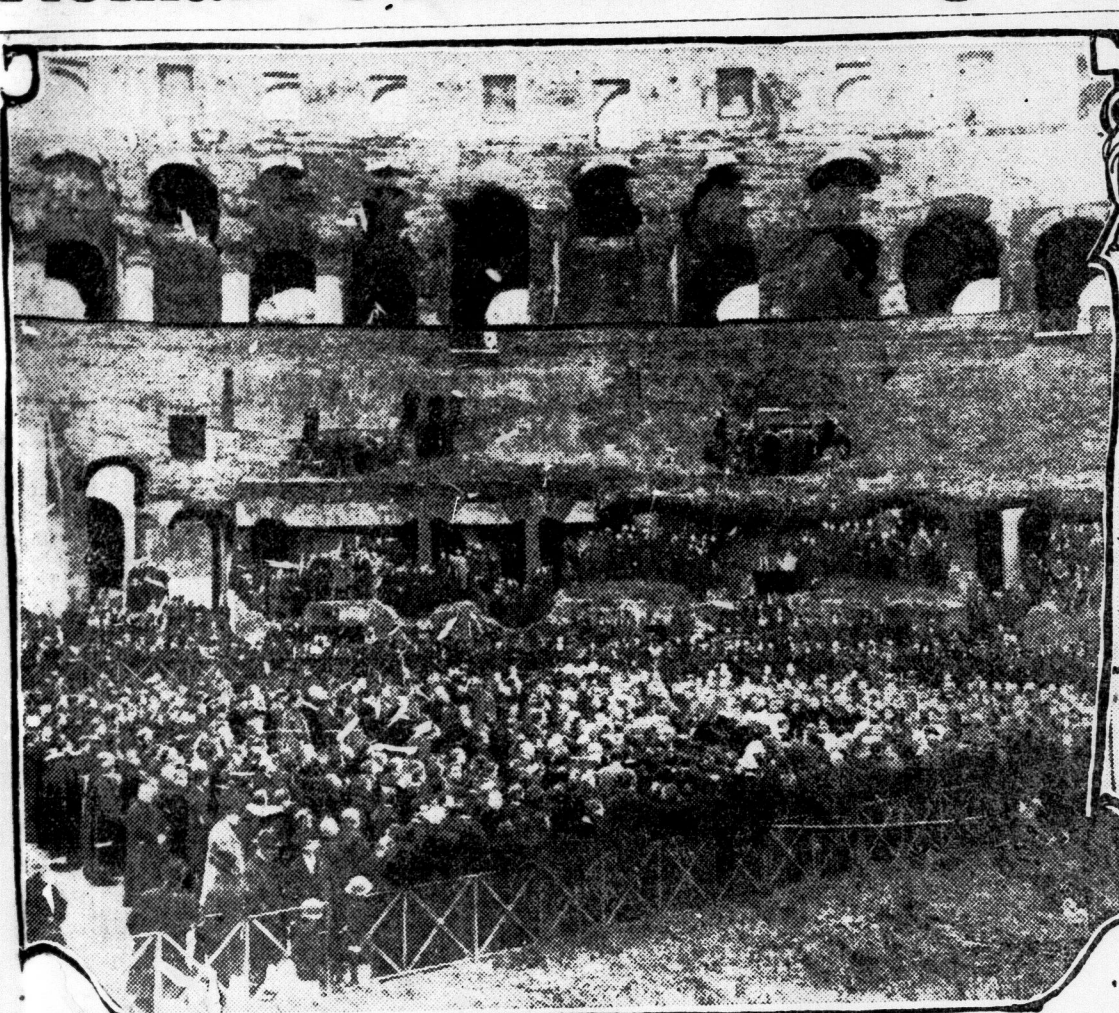


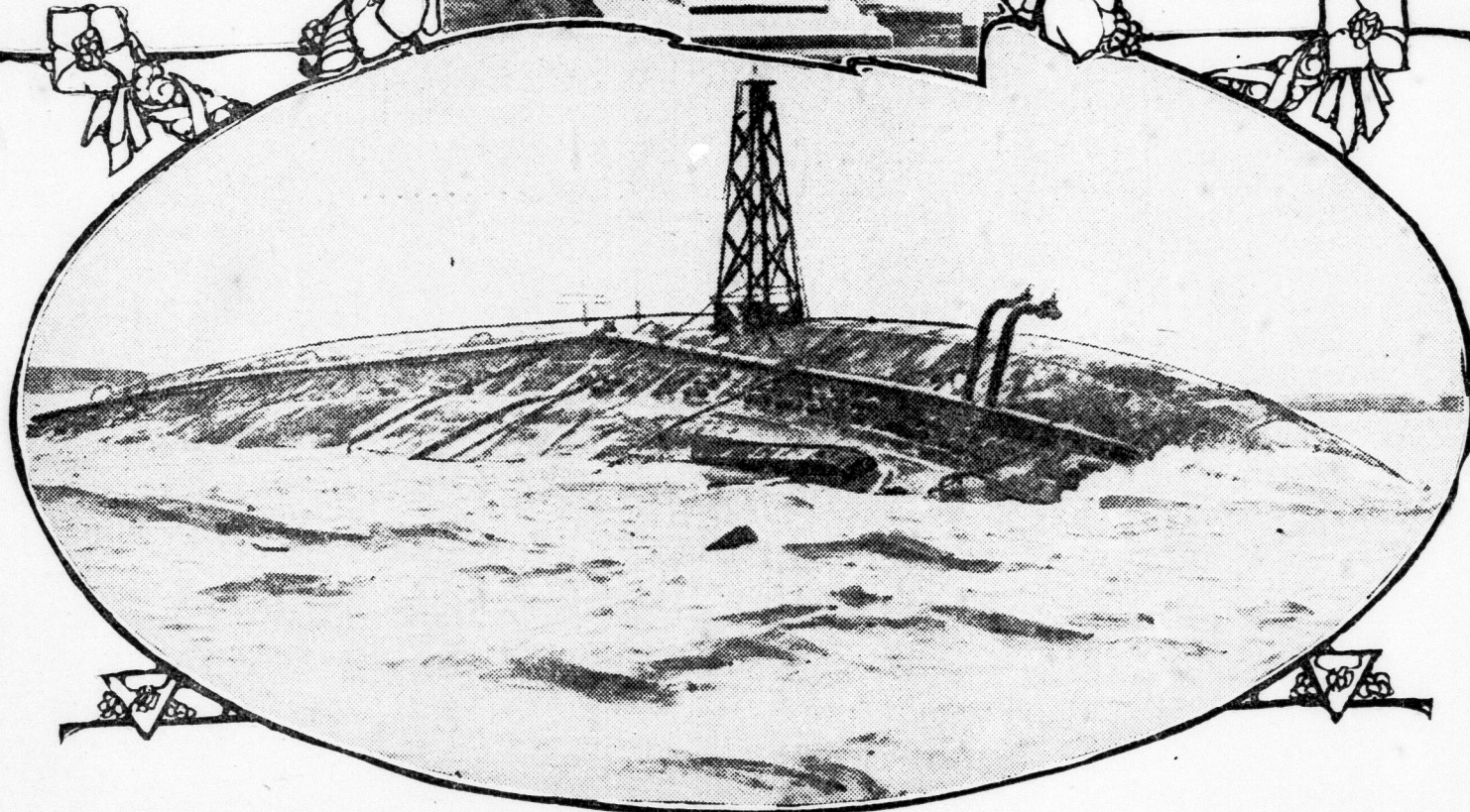
# Roman Coliseum's Religious Glory Restored :: Speed Typtist Holds Record



**CROSS REPLACED IN ROMAN COLISEUM**—The ceremonies marking the dedication of the cross of the church on the spot where the early Christians died. In deference to the pope's wishes that the arena's pristine religious glory be restored, Premier Mussolini ordered the replacement. Since 1870, when the first cross was removed, it has been a public place.
