Tokio, Sept. 18.—General Count Maresuke Nogi, Supreme Military Councillor of the Empire, and his wife, the Countess Nogi, committed suicide to-night, in accordance with the ancient Japanese custom, as their final tribute to their departed Emperor and friend, Mutsubito.
