

ARBOR DAY OBSERVANCE.

HINTS FOR GUIDANCE AT THE ANNUAL TREE PLANTING.

Interesting instructions from the Education Department as to the variety of trees most suitable for healthy growth in Ontario.

The Education Department has just issued complete and interesting instructions with regard to the observance of Arbor Day (May 6) throughout the province.

The regulations in regard to the school accommodations, provided that the school grounds should be properly leveled and drained, planted with shade trees, and enclosed with a substantial fence.

The first Friday in May shall be set apart by the trustees of every school for the purpose of planting shade trees and beautifying the school grounds.

It is the duty of the trustees to select the most suitable trees and shrubs for the purpose, and to see that the soil and the site are properly prepared.
