TO TEST KEROSENE.—Fill a glass three parts full with the petroleum to be tested, and fill up the glass with boiling water, at the same time holding a flame over it. If the vapour disengaged becomes ignited, the petroleum is not safe.

SUGAR CANDY.—Three cups of sugar, half a cup of water. Boil without stirring until brittle when dropped into water. Just before you take it from the fire add a small spoonful of butter, any flavouring liked, and a half teaspoonful of saleratus dissolved in a little water. Pour into buttered plates, when cool pull until white.

APPLE SNOWBALL. Boil one half pound of rice in milk till nearly cooked; then strain, peel and core some large apples without dividing them. Put a clove and some sugar in the centre of each apple, and the rice around them. Tie each up in a cloth separately, boil for three-quarters of an hour; remove the cloth and place on a warm dish.

LITTLE PUDDINGS. -Two ounces of fine LITTLE PUDDINGS.—Two ounces of fine bread crumbs, three tablespoonfuls of any sort of jam, one ounce of sweet almonds blanched and beaten smooth in a mortar, and two well-beaten eggs. Beat all thoroughly together and add one ounce of butter softened to the consistency of cream. Fill buttered cups half-full with the mixture and bake twenty minutes in a slow oven.

BREAKFAST CAKE. -- Put a piece of butter the size of an egg into a quart of milk and let them become warm enough to melt the butter. Stir in flour sufficient to make a stiff batter and add two teaspoonfuls of salt. Dissolve one-third of a cake of compressed yeast in a little warm water and mix with the batter. Cover tightly, let it stand in a warm place over might, and fry on a griddle.

PLAIN TEA CAKES. Two cups of sifted flour, one teaspoonful of melted butter, one egg mixed with a cup of milk, one teaspoonful of soda and one teaspoonful of cream of tartar dissolved in hot water. (Instead of the soda and cream of tartar, one and a half teaspoonful of labling powdersified with the teaspoonfuls of baking powder sifted with the flour may be used.) Mix well and bake in muffin rings for twenty minutes in a very

WAFFLES.—One and a half pints of flour; one teaspoonful of cream of tartar; half a teaspoonful of soda; two eggs; one pint of milk; two tablespoonfuls of butter. Mix the flour, cream of tartar, and soda well together and then rub through a sieve. Beat until very light, then add to them the milk and the butter, first melting the latter in two tablespoonfuls of water. Stir the mixture into the flour and bake in the usual way. into the flour and bake in the usual way.
