THE CONVENTION OF 1895.

The Annual Convention of the Association of Protestant Teachers of the Province of Quebec, for the year 1895, has come and gone, and everybody who was present has pronounced it a success. There were some misgivings at first as to its issue, considering the number of years that have elapsed since the Convention has been held outside of Montreal. The teachers had come to look upon Montreal as the natural centre of such a meeting, and it was thought that the attendance would be small and the interest taken in its proceedings be less enthusiastic than in former years; but as things have turned out, the attendance at all the sessions was gratifying, the Art Hall—where the meetings were held—being well filled, and sometimes crowded, while the interest in the discussions was perhaps as intense, if not more so, than in former years. The President acquitted himself in the most praiseworthy manner, both as an organizer and as one accustomed to preside at large gatherings, and it was a well-merited reward meted out to him that he should be re-elected for another term of office. The arrangements of the local committee were all that could be desired; and, as has been said, everybody went away eminently satisfied with all that had been done for the comfort of the visitors to the capital of the Eastern Townships.
