Educational Intelligence.

CAPE BRETON CO. ACADEMY.—The half yearly public examinations of the Schools in this place were held on Thursday and Friday week. Examiners and visitors present at each expressed their satisfaction at the progress of the Scholars and the general efficiency of the Schools. The High School, by Mr. Siewright; the Intermediate, by Miss Harrington, and the Primary, by Miss Archibald, were examined on Thursday; and the Preparatory, by Mr. Archibald, on the following day. Miss Harrington, who has an excellent school, manages her classes with great success; and so likewise does Miss Archibald, despite the difficulties inseparable from all Primary schools—which are rarely overcome without great pains and unceasing care. Mr. Archibald is rapidly regaining the ground lost by his predecessor, and bids fair shortly to have restored to his school its wonted efficiency and good deportment on the part of the pupils. In the High School, Mr. Siewright rules with discretion, and the required influences of acknowledged authority are in full force in his classes. Rev. Drs. Uniacke and McLeod addressed his pupils, urging them to increased application; congratulating them especially for their advancement in Classics, and the ability displayed by them in Mathematics, and concluding their remarks by pointed reference to the advantages which their school afforded of obtaining an acquaintance with the higher branches of Education, and the increased standing which the High School was evidently taking.—*C.
