THE CANADIAN BANKS.

The leading items in the September bank statement compare as follows:—

WHEAT AND BARLEY TRADE OF CANADA.

Through the courtesy of the Commissioner of Customs in Ottawa, I have received the following statement of the quantity of Wheat, Flour, Barley and Malt imported into, and exported from the Dominion of Canada during the fiscal year ended 30th June, 1882.

Wheat, bushels, 2,931,219; Flour, barrels, 200,428; Barley, bushels, 9,490; Malt, bushels, 11,493.

The Secretary of the Bureau of Industries in Toronto has issued a pamphlet of agricultural returns dated 12th instant, in which he estimates the wheat crop of the Province of Ontario alone for 1882.

Total Fall and Spring wheat, 4,648,196. In his July report he gives the number of acres under wheat in this Province.

The net exports of Barley for year ending 30 June, 1882, were bushels, 11,578,956.

The net exports of Barley and Malt together: 1875-6 1876-7 1877-8 1878-9.

The figures do not correspond exactly with the returns of Barley and Malt entered in United States for duty in the above year, but the variation is not important.

Large as the Canada Barley crop of 1881 was, 2 1/2 million bushels more than in any previous year, the crop of 1882 is still larger.

That judgment settled the dispute in New York; why is it not allowed to settle it here? The natural conclusion would seem to be that the piano of the "other Decker" can only be sold by "kicking up a dust," and the more it is thrown in the people's eyes the better for his purpose.
