ST. BRENDAN'S CHURCH.

DEDICATED AT ROCKPORT, THURSDAY, JULY 14.

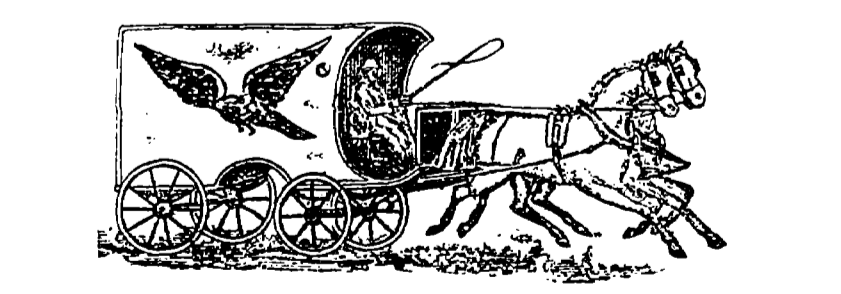
