## Grants


To meet some of the objectives listed in the Act of Parliament that created the Institute, funds are made available to individuals and organizations in order to encourage public discussion of issues of international peace and security and to sponsor research projects in the four areas of the Institute's mandate namely; arms control, disarmament, defence and conflict resolution.

The Public Programmes and Research Grants Advisory Committees, each composed of three non-CIIPS advisors from differing backgrounds, continued to review all grant requests received and make recommendations to the Executive Director and to the relevant committees of the Board of Directors. The criteria for making grants are kept under review, and in the light of experience, modified as appropriate.


During the year 190 grant applications were received totalling \$3,183,833. Of these, 123 were for Public Programmes grants and 67 for Research. The Institute was pleased to be able to make 106 grants totalling \$1,021,950. Seventy-three grants were made in the Public Programmes category and 33 grants in Research.

Lists of all grants are at annexes F and G. The diagrams below provide an overview of their distribution. The distribution by area of the mandate is inevitably judgmental because many projects do not clearly fit any single category. It should also be noted that it is the nature of the project that determines its characterization, not the type of applicant.
