JERUSHLEN (HP) - EXTERNAL HFFAIRS MINISTER JDE ÜLARK LEFT ISRAEL TODAY After Promising Human Rights Activist Mnatoly Shcharrnsky That Canada Mill Keep Fighting for the Rights of Soviet Jens to Emigrates Canadian Deficials Said.

CLARK ALSO MAS REPORTED TO HAVE ADVISED SHCHARANSKY NOT TO PUSH HIMSELF TOD HARD AND TO REST FROM HIS NIME-YEAR ORDEAL IN SOVJET PRISONS AND LABOR CAMPS.

SHCHARANSKY, WHO WAS RELEASED ON FER. 11: VISITED CLARK AT HIS HOTEL Suite through a service elevator for a 40-hinute meeting Sunday; the Minister's spokesman said.

CLARK LATER TOLD REPORTERS HE BELIEVED CANADA'S PRESSURE ON THE KREMLIN ""HAD SOMETHING TO DO"" WITH SHCHARANSKY'S RELEASE AS PART OF AN ERST-WEST PRISONER EXCHANGE FOUR YEARS BEFORE THE DISSIDENT'S SENTENCE WAS COMPLETED.

SHCHARANSKY, 38, MAS THE SPOKESMAN FOR THE SOVIET DISSIDENT HOVEHENT AND THE UNOFFICIAL HELSKINKI AGREEMENTS HATCHDOG COMMITTEE UNTIL HIS Contacts with Hestern Reporters led to his arrest in 1977 on charges of spying for the United States.

SHCHARRANSKY HAS SAID TO HAVE ACCEPTED CLARK'S INVITATION TO VISIT CANADA: BUT THE FORMER MATHEMATICIAN WAS SAID STILL NOT DECIDED WHETHER HE MOULD INCLUDE CANADA IN HIS PLANNED TRIP TO THE UNITED STATES NEXT MONTH.

GIVES ADVICE

"BON'T PUSH YOURSELF TOO MUCH"" SPOKESMAN SEAN BRADY BUDTED CLARK AS Advising Shcharansky, and complained of Difficulties Sleeping.

BRADY SAID SHCHARANSKY GAVE CLARK A LIST OF SOVIET ACTIVISTS AND ASKED FOR CANADA'S INTERVENTION. HE QUOTED THE MINISTER AS SAYING ALL THE NAMES HAD ALREADY APPERRED ON LISTS SUBMITTED BY CANADA TO THE KREMLIN; BUT THAT OTTAWA WOULD PUSH THESE CASES AGAIN.

BRADY SAID CANADA FIRST APPEALED TO SOVIET AUTHORITIES ON Shcharansky's benalf in 1976. NCGILL University Law Professor Irwin Cotler Prepared an 800-page legal brief to appeal wis conviction. Claak told reporters he agreed with Shcharansky's ''Balanced

BUT BRADY REPORTED THAT SHCHARANSKY ''STRONGLY DISAGREED'' WHEN CLARK Suggested that some individual cases could be set back if they become the object of a public campaign.

"THOSE WHO HAVE ASKED TO GET OUT NAVE ALREADY MADE THEIR COMMITMENTS So they can't be murt by pressures" Brady guoted Shcharansky as saying.

BEFORE LEAVING FOR PARIS TODAYS CLARK SAID HIS TOUR OF JORDANS SAUDI ARABIAS EGYPT AND ISRAEL HAD BEEN "MOST INSTRUCTIVE" ON MIDEAST ISSUES.

DURING HIS FOUR DAYS IN ISRAELS THE MINISTER VISITED THE YAD VASHEM MEMORIAL TO THE SIX MILLION JENISH VICTIMS OF THE HOLDCAUST AND SIGNED AN AIR TRANSPORT AGREEMENT NITH ISRAEL.

CLARK SAID SUNDAY THAT CANADA SUPPORTED THE UNITED STATES IN ITS INTENTION TO RESPOND AGRINST LIBYA'S SUPPORT OF INTERNATIONAL TERRORS BUT URGED AGRINST EXTREME ACTION.

CLARK TOLD HIS NEWS CONFERENCE: "WE HAVE INDICATED OUR VIEW THAT TERRORISMS WHICH BREAKS THE RULES OF A CIVILIZED SOCIETYS NEEDS TO BE RESPONDED TOS THAT LANGUAGE ALONE IS NOT ENOUGHS THAT IF THE STATE IS INVOLVED IN THE ACT OF ENCOURAGEMENT OF TERRORISMS THAT MUST BE TAKEN, ACCOUNT OF. AND HE SUPPORT THE POSITION OF THE UNITED STATES IN THAT REGRAD."

HE SAID CRHADE HED URGED THE UNITED STATES "TO AVOID EXTREME RCTION," ALTHOUGH HE DID NOT CLARIFY WHAT MERSURES HE BELIEVED SHOULD BE TAKEN.

CLARK SPOKE RS JOHN WHITEHERDS U.S. DEPUTY STATE SECRETARYS SAID IN R CBS TELEVISION INTERVIEW THAT PRESIDENT RONALD REAGRA WAS CONSIDERING OPTIONS FOR RETALIATION AGRINST LIBYAN INVOLVEMENT IN TERRORISM. CLARK SAID HE WAS CONCERNED FOR THE SAFETY OF CANADIAN CITIZENS LIVING
