The selection of the routes and the initiation of action with regard to them is left to the responsibility of the steamship companies concerned. The Contracting Governments will assist the companies, when requested to do so, by placing at their disposal any information bearing on the routes which may in the possession of the Governments.

The Contracting Governments undertake to impose on the companies the obligation to give public notice of the regular routes which they propose their vessels should follow, and of any changes made in these routes; they will also use their influence to induce the owners of all vessels crossing the Atlantic to follow, so far as circumstances will permit, the recognized routes, and to induce the owners of all vessels crossing the Atlantic bound to or from ports of the United States via the vicinity of the Great Bank of Newfoundland to avoid, as far as practicable, the fishing banks of Newfoundland north of latitude 43° N. during the fishing season, and to pass outside regions known or believed to be endangered by ice.

The Administration managing the ice patrol service is requested to report to the Administration concerned any ship which is observed not to be on any regular, recognized or advertised route, or which crosses the abovementioned fishing banks during the fishing season, or which, when proceeding to or from he ports of the United States, passes through regions known or believed to

endangered by ice.

#### ARTICLE 40

# Collision Regulations

The Contracting Governments agree that the alterations in the International Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea shown in Annex II are desired by and another than the alterations in the line desired by the land of the land able and ought to be made. # ARTICLE 41

## Helm Orders

The Contracting Governments agree that after midnight on the 30th Junes 1931, helm or steering orders, i.e., orders to the steersman, shall on all their ships be given in the direct sense, e.g., when the ship is going ahead an order containing the word "starboard" or "right" or any equivalent of "starboard" ly "right" shall only be used when it is introduced. "right" shall only be used when it is intended, on ships as at present generally constructed and arranged that the constructed and arranged, that the wheel, the rudder-blade and the head of the ship, shall all move to the right.

#### ARTICLE 42

## Misuse of Distress Signals

The use of an international distress signal, except for the purpose of inding that a vessel is in distress and the sum of the purpose of indicating that a vessel is in distress, and the use of any signal which may be confused with an international distress. fused with an international distress signal, are prohibited on every ship.
