Did the Minister of National Health and Welfare state that, in 1972, the top 20 per cent of Canadians received more of the wealth produced than they did in 1967 and that the bottom 20 per cent received less in 1972 than in 1967 and, if so, what measures are under consideration to augment the programmes of income redistribution so that the trend can be reversed?—Sessional Paper No. 301-2/1,475.

1. With reference to the answer to Question No. 46 of the Second Session of the 29th Parliament, which states in part that a total of \$2,823,987 was allocated under the Local Initiatives Programme for 1972-73 in the constituency of Cape Breton Highlands-Canso, Nova Scotia (a) what are the names of all projects involved along with their addresses and the names and addresses of those signing the applications (b) in each case what is a detailed description of the actual project, specifically including the functions performed under the project?

2. What are the names and addresses of all persons or organizations who recommended each project in any manner whatsoever to the Department?—Sessional Paper No. 301-2/60.

Bill C-32, An Act to impose a charge on the export of crude oil and certain petroleum products, to provide compensation for certain petroleum costs and to regulate the price of Canadian crude oil and natural gas in inter-provincial and export trade, was again considered in Committee of the Whole, reported with amendments, concurred in at the report stage, as amended, and ordered for a third reading at the next sitting of the House.
