# OLYMPIC (1976) ACT

### AMENDMENT COVERING ISSUE OF GOLD COINS

Hon. Jean Chrétien (President of the Treasury Board) moved that Bill C-63, an act to amend the Olympic (1976) Act, be read the third time and do pass.

Mr. Serge Joyal (Maisonneuve-Rosemont): Madam Speaker, understandably, as host of the 1976 Olympic Games to be held in the Maisonneuve-Rosemount riding, in Montreal, I would have liked to speak several times during the debate on Bill C-63 this week.

During the course of the debate, reference was made on several occasions to the administration of the Olympic Games, as also to the way in which the city of Montreal was discharging its mandate. Reference was also made to the personality of the mayor and the responsibilities of the federal government towards the 1976 Olympic Games. I should like to take this opportunity to straighten out the facts to which the interventions of the hon. members pertained.

Madam Speaker, the first allusion was made to the administration entrusted to the organizing committee of the 1976 Olympic Games by the Quebec National Assembly. Doubt was expressed that COJO could meet the standards, that it could grant contracts while respecting
