

WOMEN'S AUXILIARY.

The Annual Report of the Women's Auxiliary for the year ending May, 1891, contains the following items:—

Two new Branches have been formed, making the total number twenty Senior Branches one sub-division of a Branch and three Junior Branches, consisting of nine hundred and sixty members against seven hundred the previous year.

The sum of \$1,158.89 has been raised for Missions. The year before it was \$898.56 only, showing an increase of \$260.33.

The education of the eldest daughter of the Rev. A. Allman (Diocese of Algoma) has been undertaken by the Quebec Branch.

The sum of \$100 has been promised the Rev. W. A. Burman, for three years, to assist in paying a lady teacher at St. Paul's Industrial School, Rupert's Land, and that of \$50 to the Rev. H. T. Bourne, for the same period, for the extension of the Indian School on the Piegan Reserve.

Quebec's share of the expenses of fitting out and sending Miss Sherlock, as Medical Missionary to Japan, will be \$150 in 1891-92.

Fifty members have joined the "Extra Cent-a-day-Fund;" an opportunity for self-denial in luxuries, &c., (open to *men*, women and children) by which \$182.50 will be contributed to Missions *over and above* anything that was given before.

The number of barrels, boxes, &c., of clothing has increased from thirty in 1890 to forty-seven in 1891. No money value is now placed upon these gifts of love sent by the following Branches:—Compton, one barrel Diocese Saskatchewan; Cookshire, one barrel Shingwauk Home; Inverness, one barrel Rev. M. Scott, (Diocese Athabasca); Lennoxville, two barrels Wawanosh Home, and one Rev. R.
