### SMOOTH SEAMS

ff the seams in garments have not been dampened when they were pressed at the time of moking, they are sure to draw and pucker later, by the shrinking of the thread. This can be shrinking of the thread. This can be remedied very successfully with a hot iron passed over them with considerable pressure on the wrong side. The seams may be pressed open or merely flat. depending on how they were treated at the time they were made. The hems of skirts show this unsightly puckering after every time they are worn in damp weather, and sometimes the hem must be well dampened before the puckers can be entirely smoothed out.


