

WILL MEETING BE A SUCCESS?

That is About What Will Happen With the High Commission, as Washington Suggests.

THE MODUS VIVENDI AND LUMBER

Are the Snags Which Have Been Struck in the Negotiations for a General Settlement.

Montreal, May 11.—(Special).—The following highly interesting despatch appears in The Herald, dated Washington, May 11: If one is to judge by the feeling manifested among officials of the State Department and leading officers of the Administration, it is only a technical violation of the truth to say that the negotiations of the Anglo-American Joint High Commission will never be resumed. No one seriously doubts that the members of the commission will re-assemble at Ottawa in August, according to the arrangement agreed on last February, but the belief here is that the new meeting will be a mere formality, and that no good result will be accomplished.

That Modus Vivendi. Your correspondent reported some time ago the disappointment, not to say irritation, felt by the Washington officials, on account of the failure of the Dominion Government to agree to the establishment of a modus vivendi regarding the Alaskan boundary. In that despatch the opinion was expressed that, inasmuch as the Dominion had not seen fit to agree to a modus vivendi, the fact did not lend much encouragement to the permanent settlement of the boundary question by the Joint High Commission. Since the date of that writing there have been new evidences of the state of feeling existing at the State Department. So strong was this feeling that a report was published on Tuesday to the effect that the negotiations of the international commission would not be resumed at all. It is learned, on undoubted authority, that this statement was too strong. The United States would certainly not refuse to allow its commissioners to proceed to Canada next August, for, officially, there is no reason to believe that the Canadian Government is not eager to reach a settlement of the questions at issue between the two countries; but there is the most serious sort of apprehension as to the outlook. Secretary Hay, for one, certainly has little confidence in further negotiations with the Dominion on the subject of an international treaty.

What the President's views are it is by no means so easy to say, but he doubtless is guided to a large extent by the opinions of the State Department, especially at a time when matters of more immediate importance in the Philippines are engaging his attention.

Fairbanks Gone to Alaska. Senator Fairbanks, president of the American commission, has gone to Alaska, with the sincere purpose of learning as much as possible about the disputed boundary and of devising some remedy for the disagreement between the Canadian and American members of the Joint Commission. He is not altogether hopeless of a successful result at the re-assembling this fall, or he would not have made the trip to Alaska territory. Friends of the Senator deny that he had made up his mind before starting on his trip that the negotiations of the commission were about to end in failure.

Washington Government Irritated. The most discouraging feature of the present situation, as viewed here, is that the Washington Government is irritated and on account of two or three acts of the Canadian Government. The most serious offence was given at Ottawa, when the Ottawa Government failed to agree to the establishment of the modus vivendi, but there is also a great deal of feeling against the action of the Ontario Provincial Legislature, which was not disapproved by the Dominion Government, in passing prohibitory legislation against the export of logs to the United States.

GOES BACK TO HUNTSVILLE

Former Treasurer of the Town Arrested in Toronto Yesterday on a Charge of Forgery.

Chief Constable McFadden of Huntsville arrived in the city yesterday afternoon. At Police Headquarters he secured the aid of Detectives Davis and Cuddy and went in search of William H. Goldolphin, who up to May 4 was a resident of Huntsville. Goldolphin was located near St. Lawrence Market and locked up at Police Headquarters. He will be taken back to Huntsville to-day. The warrant charging Goldolphin with forging the name of Emma McLaughlin to a cheque for \$200 on W. H. Matthews & Co.'s private bank, Huntsville, on May 2.

The prisoner was at one time treasurer of Huntsville. He left the town suddenly some years ago, taking with him a considerable amount of money. He was captured some time after, and sentenced to three years in Kingston Penitentiary. After his discharge from that institution he returned to Huntsville and opened up an office as conveyancer, real estate agent, etc. It is said that while acting for Mrs. McLaughlin in a transfer of an hotel house from Peter Kelly the alleged offence was committed.
