

Extracts From the Revised Statutes of Ontario, 1897, Chapter 223.

The right of voting at municipal elections shall belong to the following persons, being men, or unmarried women, or widows, of the full age of twenty-one years, and subjects of Her Majesty by birth or naturalization, and being rated, to the amount hereinafter provided, on the revised assessment roll of the municipality upon which the voters' list used at the election is based, for real property held in their own right (or, in case of married men, held by their wives), or for income, and having received no reward and having upon expectation or reward, for voting;

Firstly: All persons, whether resident or not, who in their own right, or whose wives are at the date of the election, freeholders of the municipality (and assessed for \$400);

Secondly: All residents of the municipality (of a property assessed for \$400);


