

CANADIAN SUGAR CROSS BORDER

Removal of the Restrictions Makes U. S. Prices Attractive Here.

OTTAWA, July 16 .- (Canadian Press) -Removal of the restrictions on the export of sugar is causing great quantities of Canadian sugar to be sent out of the country, especially from Ontario points, to the United States, according to ad-vices received here. It is stated that even small storekeepers are exporting. Under the board of commerce regula-tions, the profit is restricted to 5 per cent. In the United States the demand abnormal, and there is no control prices, while Canadian exporters also ave the benefit of the exchange.


