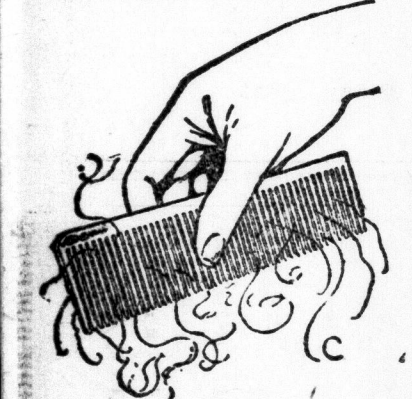

QUANTITIES OF CANADIAN SUGAR CROSS BORDER

Removal of the Restrictions Makes U. S. Prices Attractive Here.

OTTAWA, July 16.—(Canadian Press)—Removal of the restrictions on the export of sugar is causing great quantities of Canadian sugar to be sent out of the country, especially from Ontario points, to the United States, according to advice received here. It is stated that even small storekeepers are exporting under the board of commerce regulations, the profit is restricted to 5 per cent. In the United States the demand is abnormal and there is no control of prices, while Canadian exporters also have the benefit of the exchange. The Government recently proposed to take authority to regulate the export of any commodity, but this legislation, after being referred to a special committee, was dropped.

MACBRIDE MAY YET CONTEST SEAT WITH 'W. F. COCKSHUTT, M.P.

Independent Labor Party of Brantford Preparing For Federal Election.

BRANTFORD, July 16.—The Brantford Independent Labor Party is preparing to place a candidate in the federal riding of Brantford in the next Dominion election, which is expected to be held in 1921. A secret meeting of the party was held this evening, at which the decision was arrived at and a committee of selection was named to present a list of possible candidates on Friday evening next. The party will make a selection from this list two weeks from that date.

Mayor M. MacBride, M.P., has times past announced his intention of contesting the seat in the federal house with W. F. Cockshutt, M.P., a political rival who has it that Mayor MacBride, who is the Independent Labor Party representative in the Legislature, will get the nomination for the federal house.

MOORE SAYS DRURY'S "STALLING COMMIS'N" WOULD STOP RADIALS

Trades Union Head Denounces Policy of Premier As Opposed To Labor.

OTTAWA, July 16.—That the commission appointed by Premier Drury was a "stalling commission" which would result in the stoppage of the hydro radial purchase project until next spring, in defiance of the policies enunciated from year to year by organized labor, and expressed at the poll by municipalities, was the statement made by President Moore at the allied trades and labor meeting in which the latter stood by Premier Drury in the attitude he had taken on the question of the Ontario radicals, saying that as the Government had to be responsible for the bonds, he would be betraying the trust of the electorate if he did not first ascertain what the project was going to cost.

VETERANS CALL UPON TORONTO MEMBERS TO RESIGN THEIR SEATS

If M. P.'s Refuse, They Will Receive Opposition.

TORONTO, July 16.—At a mass meeting of veterans tonight in Queen's Park, who a hearty welcome was given to J. Harry Flynn on the occasion of his return from a tour of the West in the United States, a resolution was passed calling upon the members of the Dominion Parliament to resign their seats. If they do not resign, they will be opposed by the veterans.

French Armies Move Upon Syrian Kingdom To Enforce Mandate

Sent 24-Hour Ultimatum, Demanding That Syria Accept French Language and Currency As Official — Syrians Offer No Resistance.

LONDON, July 17.—The French have begun operations in Syria, moving toward Aleppo and Damascus, according to a report printed in the London Times this morning.

Advices have been received in London, says the Times, that the French on Wednesday sent a 24-hour ultimatum to Faisal, King of Syria, demanding his acquiescence in the French mandate for Syria, and also in the adoption of French as the official language, and of the franc as the official currency.

Being accustomed to playing the ponies through betting commissions, the lady visitors commenced hunting for a bookie in Windsor, ignoring the parlours, and found a youth with an honest face, a friend of the train acquaintance, and trusted their money to him.

NATIONAL STEAMSHIP SERVICE ON PACIFIC

MONTREAL, July 16.—R. B. Teakie, general manager of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine, announced today the establishment of a trade route on the Pacific side of Canada from Vancouver to the Far East.

FIRM NOT BLAMED FOR COASTER FATALITY

TORONTO, July 16.—The company operating the roller coaster at Hurlingham Point was absolved by a coroner's jury tonight from blame for the death of Walter Morrison, who fell out of a car on the roller coaster and was killed on July 1.

STRIKE INEVITABLE ON BORDER RAILWAY

NIAGARA FALLS, Ont., July 16.—A strike on the International Railway tomorrow seemed inevitable here tonight. Efforts to bring about a settlement of the dispute between the company and the employees failed, and it was believed tonight that the strike would take place at 6 o'clock Saturday evening.

BRITISH NEWS SERVICE

VICTORIA, B. C., July 16.—Initiation of an all-British news service for the empire, so as to remove the necessity of employing agencies dominated by foreign interests will be urged by representatives of the Victoria Board of Trade at the ninth congress of Empire Chambers of Commerce, to be held in Toronto, from Sept. 14 to 17, inclusive.

WHEAT BOARD WILL NOT TOUCH CROP THIS YEAR

Pre-War Methods To Prevail Unless Control Becomes Necessary.

OTTAWA, July 16.—The Government has decided that the present wheat board will not touch the crop this year. The marketing of this crop will revert to the usual and normal methods of pre-war times.

WINDSOR BARRISTER ATTACKS ACTION OF ATTORNEY-GENERAL

Prison Sentences For First Offences Against Liquor Laws Are Instructions.

WINDSOR, July 16.—"It has come to a pretty state of affairs when the attorney-general of the province dictates to the judiciary as to what sentences a magistrate can impose upon violators of liquor laws," declared Frank W. Wilson, prominent Windsor barrister today, in a attack upon recent measures taken by Toronto authorities to curb rum-running on the Essex border.

The attorney-general has advised the magistrate in future to impose prison terms for first offences, and according to the new version of the law, first offences are vastly different to what they previously were.

LIFE IN LATIN QUARTER TO BE SHOWN IN MOVIES

Paris, July 16.—Paris' world-famous Latin quarter is to be exploited. A syndicate has been formed to reveal the life and customs of the quarter in motion pictures, lectures and magazine articles. Material is now being collected for an exhibition of drawings, sketches and photographs dealing with the life of the quarter at the Paris University since it was founded.

ORDERS TO PROCEED WITH LAND WORK ON HYDRO POWER CANAL

ST. CATHARINES, July 16.—Instructions have been issued to the contractors to proceed with the work on the Welland ship canal to proceed with the land work. Chief Engineer Grant announced at noon, work to commence as soon as the necessary labor is available. A ten-hour day schedule is to go into force, and the scale of wages agreed upon for the hydro power canal is to be observed.

LEEDSA, Sask., July 16.—The motor car, it seems, has achieved another success by winning its advent into the cattle rustling business. The old and well-known practice of cattle rustlers when they used to drive their stolen herds before a moving thing of the past. A few days ago three calves were rustled from herds near Bengough and spirited across the international border in two motor cars. Three of the rustlers were arrested on this side of the line, two others in Montana and are now awaiting trial.

CANCELS ORDER IF ENGLAND HAS BARRED RUSSIAN

Canadian Firm To Lose \$6,000,000 Order If Deportation True.

NEW YORK, July 16.—(By the Associated Press).—The Russian Soviet bureau here sent notification this morning to the Board of Immigration and Naturalization in the event of the reported deportation of Santel Nuxteva from England, proving true, the contract entered into between the Soviet agency and the Montreal firm for \$6,000,000 worth of supplies for Russia will have to be cancelled.

DUBLIN, July 16.—A number of police and military, making arrests at Ballylanders, Limerick, today clashed with a party of men, some of whom were concealed in houses. The fire was returned, and one civilian was wounded. Seven men were arrested, and a large quantity of arms and ammunition were seized.

TURK NATIONALISTS ATTACK GREEK SHIPS IN THE BLACK SEA

Dominate All Anatolia Ports and Frigate Entente. Shipowners.

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 16.—(By the Associated Press).—The Turkish Nationalists have begun an attack upon Greek shipping in the Black Sea. The Greek steamer Filia, on entering Keras, west of Trebizond, from Batumi, on July 14, was seized by Nationalists who took the vessel's officers prisoner, but the cargo in charge and seized 7,000,000 rubles.

LABOR DISPUTE HOLDS UP AQUITANIA'S SAILING
