Five Thousand Seven Hundred Cattle Disposed of Yesterday.

CALVES WERE LOWER

Sheep and Lambs - Were Active at Last Week's Prices.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards yesterday consisted of 345 calves, 1,200 sheep, 1,200 pigs, 2,000 lambs and 807 horses.

There was a run of 5700 cattle at the Union Stock Yards yesterday. Good cattle of all grades were steady to firm at last week's prices. This was especially so in regard to good to choice butcher steers and calves. The market was quite active on all good cattle, while the common grades were weak to steady. Sheep were firm.
