Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

over 18 years old, may homestead a qua-ter-section of available Dominion land plicant must appear in person at the Do-minion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within ains miles of his homestead on a farm of sale least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required, except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his accuested. Price, \$2.00 per acre. alongside his months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres' extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon a homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$3.00 per acre. acre.

Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres, and erect a house worth \$300.
