BURNS CAUSE HER DEATH.

Moncton, Aug. 22—Little Dora Aulrey, aged two and one-half years, who was terribly burned last evening while playing with her young brother in the yard near their home, Archibald street, died in the hospital here today. She was the daughter of Alfred T. Aulrey, C. G. R. brakeman, who was out on the railway when the accident occurred. The child was discovered with her clothing on fire. Policeman Killen, hearing cries for help ran to the assistance of those who were trying to rescue the little one, and it was thought last night had succeeded in saving the child's life but, today, she succumbed to her injuries. The cause of the accident is not definitely known but it is thought the children were playing with matches.

LOCAL NEWS

The annual meeting of the Union of New Brunswick municipalities which was to have been held in the city has been postponed until October.

Rev. George Titus of Indiana, a former pastor of the Coburg street Christian church, gave an informal address last evening to a large audience in the Douglas avenue Christian church.

C. W. Baxter, chief fruit inspector of the fruit branch, Ottawa, arrived in the city last night enroute to Nova Scotia to examine into the state of the apple crop this year with a view to making arrangements to market it in Western and middle Canada.

The Lancaster Red Cross fair was again visited by large crowds last evening and the booths and other attractions were kept rushing to meet the demand. The Temple band rendered delightful music. E. L. Taylor won a beautiful quilt and H. M. Stanbury won a vacuum cleaner.

Police Matron Ross returned on the Digby boat yesterday afternoon from Yarmouth, where she had gone to bring back Mrs. Maude Titus, on the charge of desertion of her five-months old baby. Mrs. Titus is being detained at the Central Station while the baby is in the Children's Shelter.

The picnic, held at McAlpine's Wharf by the local colored people in conjunction with the colored people from Fredericton, was brought to a close yesterday, the local folk returning to the city and their Fredericton friends returning to the capital. The picnic lasted from Monday until yesterday and a pleasant time was spent.

At the last session of the inquest into the circumstances of the death of H. L. Williams a sensational story was told by two young girls, Gertrude Wedge and Gertrude Wilkins of a "joy ride," but there was no intimation as to what connection this had with the crime. Tonight when the coroner's court meets again it is expected that the missing link will be supplied.

When Hamm Brothers' store, Main street, was broken into recently, a large piece of chewing gum, well chewed, was found on the premises. There was an excellent impression of the person's lower teeth in the gum. This was reproduced in a plaster cast. All the youths under suspicion had their lower jaws examined and one was found to have a set of lower teeth resembling the impression in the gum. The boy admitted breaking into the establishment.

RECENT DEATHS

Mrs. H. E. Bennett. The death occurred yesterday of Mrs. Bennett, wife of the Rev. H. E. Bennett, rector of Lower Jemseg. She was an English lady who came out here last year to be married. Her death was quite sudden. Rev. Mr. Bennett is well known in St. John he having acted as locum tenens at the Mission church St. John Baptist last spring. He will have the sympathy of many friends in his affliction. Interment will take place today at Jemseg.

Grant-Brown. St. George, Aug. 22—A pretty wedding was celebrated in St. George's church at 7:30 Tuesday morning, when Miss Alice Brown, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Brown, was united in the holy bonds of matrimony to Arthur L. Grant, of Tower Hill. Rev. Father McGibney, S. J., performed the marriage rite and a large number of relatives and friends of the young pair were present.

Caleb B. Bill. Caleb B. Bill, collector of customs, Wolfville, died suddenly on Tuesday morning, at his home in that town. He was a son of the late Hon. Wm. C. Bill, M. P. for Kings county, and a member of the Holms-Township Government. He was a grandson of the late Hon. Caleb R. Bill, M. P. for Kings, prior to Confederation, and one of the senators appointed for Nova Scotia at time of Confederation.

The deceased twice unsuccessfully contested Kings county for the House of Commons against the late Sir Frederick Borden.

His children are William, in the Canadian west; Philip (partner of late Judge Laurence), now in Justice Department, Ottawa; Emmerson and Paul at Ottawa; and Gordon, professor, U. S. Marine Corps, New Hampshire, U. S. Margaret, wife of Col. E. G. Shannon (at the time the war broke out with the Canadian Bank of Commerce), now in France; Ethel, domestic science teacher, Halifax.

Mr. Bill removed from Billtown to Wolfville on his appointment as collector of customs. He owned one of the finest farms in Kings county, now owned by Caleb R. Bill, Jr., a cousin. He was interested in stock-raising, and had some very fine horses. One "Rampart" had more than a local reputation.

The deceased was very highly esteemed, and his sudden death will be deeply regretted. He was sixty-five years of age.

Hon. James D. McInnis, Liberal member of the legislature for the second district of Kings, died at his home in St. Peter's, P. E. I., recently.

Miss Mrs. McMonagle died at her home in Windsor, N. S., last evening after a lengthy illness. William McMonagle of the news staff of the Standard is a brother.

The death of John A. Dewitt, former mayor and station agent for G. P. R., at Harvey, occurred yesterday at the Chipman Memorial Hospital in St. Stephen.

Mrs. Sarah Hughes Gardiner, keeper of the Gardiner House at Allegheny, at the headwaters of the St. John river, died recently. She was seventy-two years old.

Dimock Wortman. The death of Dimock Wortman occurred at the home of his brother, G. T. Wortman, 877 Latis street, Moncton, on Wednesday. Death was due to heart trouble. The funeral will be held on Friday.
