



Mexico Heading Towards Sanity

Recent Changes Effecting in Internal Policy Give Ground for Optimism, According to Washington Reports

Washington, Nov. 10.—The Mexican Belagion here is receiving advices from the Carranza government that indicate a gradual restoration of a sane and settled state of society generally and a return to the normal industrial activity of all sections of the country.

On November 19, the first Workingmen's Congress will meet in Merida, capital of Yucatan. All questions affecting the working people will be discussed and measures taken to secure the carrying out of the reforms pledged by the resolution.

The export tariff on silver and copper for the month of November has been established as follows:

Silver in bars or ingots, \$3.461 per kilo; in concentrates, \$4.264 per kilo; copper in bars or ingots, \$0.914 per kilo; in concentrates, \$0.7892 per kilo.

These rates are in 'Oro Nacional', or Mexican specie, and represent exactly half the amounts given in American gold or currency.

Wages in Mexican Specie. By a recent decree issued by the first chief, all salaries and wages of any class whatever throughout the republic are made payable solely in Mexican specie or its equivalent in the legal issue of paper currency, the former being established as the standard without regard to fluctuations in exchange values.

This method has already been adopted by a number of the large employers of labor, notably certain leading oil and mining companies.

Following the decree recently issued establishing specie as the basis for payment of all salaries and wages to workers of whatever class, Governor Espinosa Miras of the State of Coahuila, has issued a notification that the minimum of any laborer in that state shall be

future be five pesos, or two dollars and one-half, gold, daily.

The customs collections at the port of Vera Cruz for the month of October approximated very nearly \$1,000,000, in national specie, showing a steady ratio of appreciation and an early return to the income of normal conditions.

General Plutarco Elias Calles, who has been the military governor of the State of Sonora throughout almost the entire revolution, has reported personally to the first chief that conditions in that state are normal, that working people have abundant employment, and every city and town within his jurisdiction is tranquil.

In Guadalajara, a private citizen has established a public dining room, where large numbers of the poor are fed daily. In this enterprise he is assisted by some of the leading merchants. The authorities have taken severe measures to deal with merchants who secrete supplies of food articles or prime necessities, government regulations requiring that they report accurately all stocks on hand.

Better Educational System. A series of teachers' institutes has been inaugurated in the State of Tamaulipas for the purpose of bringing the educational system up to the highest standard.

The governor of Guanajuato has taken steps to compel dealers in food articles of common use to charge only reasonable prices therefor, the tendency having been to demand exorbitant rates. A fixed scale will be published after due examination of the cost of various products.

REPORT OF NEW STEAMER LINE TO NEW YORK CITY

Boston, Nov. 14.—It is reported that Charles W. Morse of New York has secured control, either by purchase or charter, of the steamships Narragansett, and Manhattan, and intends to inaugurate a service between New York and Boston next season, in competition with the Eastern Steamship Corporation.

The new line will, it is said, make daily trips, using the Cape Cod Canal.

TO OPEN 18 NIGHT SCHOOLS FOR FOREIGNERS

Los Angeles, Cal., Nov. 14.—Fifty thousand dub women of Los Angeles are co-operating with the federal immigration commission and the school board in initiating new standards of education for the foreign population.

The first step will be the opening of eighteen night schools for the foreign population on November 20.

Members of the Federation of Women's Clubs, the Parent-Teacher Associations and the teaching staff will get into personal touch with prospective pupils. The Chamber of Commerce, churches, branch libraries, foreign newspapers and large employers are co-operating.

The general movement is the outgrowth of a social survey made of the city under the direction of the state commission on immigration and housing, the first scientific analysis of the kind made by a western city in this country. The new night schools will be maintained the year round.
