

FORMAL SANCTION GIVEN BY M. A. H. A.

Marysville's Application in Northern Section is Denied by Association

Formal sanction of the application of Sussex, Moncton and Saint John to conduct a group of the M. A. H. A. this winter was made at the 17th meeting yesterday.

PROVINCE DIVIDED.

On recommendation of the New Brunswick delegates to the meeting and after considerable previous open discussion, the meeting decided that New Brunswick should be divided into a southern league consisting of Moncton, Sussex and Saint John, and a northern league consisting of Campbellton, Bathurst, Chatham and Fredericton.

St. Stephen, it was decided, would be eligible, in the event of not being admitted to either the northern or southern leagues, to compete in the championship play-off.

BY-LAWS FAIL TO PASS.

By-laws recently passed by the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association regarding a new defence arrangement of 40 feet instead of 20 feet as heretofore and requiring the width of goal tenders' pads to be reduced from 14 inches to 12 inches, were not adopted.

RULE SUSPENDED.

The question of permitting Dartmouth to use Halifax men in the Halifax City League was pleaded by W. C. Bishop and A. C. Pettipas of the Dartmouth club. The recommendation that the Maritime Province branch of the Amateur Athletic Union be asked to suspend the "red-gold rule" for hockey in its relation to these two communities was unanimously supported.
