### ARE THE SCHOOLS TO COLLAPSE?

(The Churchman.)

A little less than a thousand teachers have left the public schools of New York city since last September to enter more lucrative employment. It has been estimated that about 20,000 teachers have dropped out of the teaching profession during the last year in the United States. Children who normally are on half-time in New York are now frequently without any teacher at all. This seems to us a grave enough matter to claim the attention of the nation. We have counted upon our public schools as our most efficient agencies of Americanization. Are we to let our school system collapse because these teachers are not entering our normal schools to prepare themselves to teach? The vocation is not any longer attractive to high school and college girls. Meanwhile a university military training bill is under advisement in Washington which promises, if it goes into effect, to cost the country \$650,000,000 a year, which is more than the whole country spent on its public schools in 1915.

### WISH MARITIME PROVINCES TO MAKE PROTEST

(Canadian Press Despatch.)

Halifax, March 22.—In the house of assembly today, Mr. Torrey, the member for Guysboro, gave notice of a resolution calling for a conference of representatives of the governments of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island to insist upon the rights of the maritime provinces, which he claims have been neglected by the federal government through their policy of western preference. Among the questions to be considered will be compensation to the maritime provinces for western school lands for subsidies to the provinces of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, and for territory annexed to the provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

Halide Edib, Ottoman Firebrand and Dangerous Agitator.

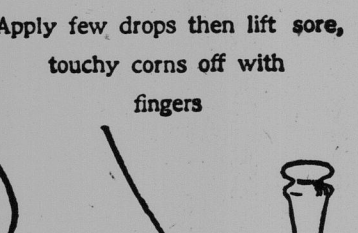
Constantinople, March 22.—Halide Edib, the most prominent woman leader among the Turkish Nationalists, and Reouf Bey, deputy minister of justice, piece of Mustafa Kemal in this city: Cara Vassif Bey and several other members of the chamber of deputies, have been deported, presumably to Malta, by the British. They were placed on board the cruiser Hibiscus yesterday shortly before that warship sailed. After Mustafa Kemal and Reouf Bey, Halide Edib was probably the best known speaker and organizer in the Nationalist movement. When the Greeks landed at Smyrna and some Turks were killed, she cast aside all traditions of Turkish women. She organized and addressed mass meetings and so inflamed the Turks here against alleged plans for the dismemberment that the allied higher commissioners forbade further meetings. She has often been described in the British press as a "firebrand and a dangerous agitator."

### Nova Scotia Farming

(Halifax Recorder.)

Nova Scotia has so many resources that we sometimes forget that the peninsula contains a splendid agricultural area as well as a fishing ground. The population of the peninsula was 240,000 in 1916. The wheat doubled this in quantity. Peas numbered more than 32,000 bushels, and beans 94,000 bushels. Potatoes are our second largest crop for the year, showing a growth of these tubers to a half million bushels. Exclusive of the land on which apples are grown, there were 2,025,689 acres cultivated, but in small crops. It is compared with the possible land of Nova Scotia, for there are about eight million acres said to be of value for farming in the province.

The apples grown last year came to a total of more than one and a half million barrels, the crop being the greatest since 1911. It is very noticeable, however, that the price of this delicious fruit has not visibly depreciated despite the great crop.

The live stock is fewer in number than the known resources of the province would lead the casual observer to believe. The horses number 70,101, the milch cows 129,585, other cattle, including calves 240,829, sheep 279,249, swine 18,537, and ducks 11,237. All these figures could be doubled without much effort, for our resources are ample. Just here it might be observed that the Halifax apple market it has always been in an unsatisfactory condition. In spite of large apple crops of the highest quality in the province, it is nearly impossible to buy a first-class apple in Halifax, and those sold are at exorbitant prices. The cause of this is that the province is it class, the best well-packed and genuine first class apples come from the Pacific coast.

To teach scientific farming and fruit-raising there are many government institutions, the most important of which is the Agricultural College at Truro, where all present there are 141 pupils in attendance. There are also a Maritime Dairy School and the Rural Science School. Besides these there are a large number of societies for the advancement of agriculture and related subjects so that in these respects the people are well provided for.

### MOTHERS! PLAQUE OF CRIME

AS POST-WAR DEBT IS SLOWLY PURGED

Much Discussion in England Over Remarkable Increase, Possible Causes, and Suggestions for Remedy.

Great wars produce an aftermath of crime and social disaster. The plague of post-war crime which was discussed in Great Britain several weeks ago is since become a theme of general remark. The chief cause to which is now a matter of general agreement. More men are prone to kill and maim before the war, because, in order to win the war, most young men of good physique had to undergo a course of physical training. But at least one contributory cause of the "wave" has been pointed out. The English police, who alone can tell, say that during the war a large part of the regular army of crime, its servants, became soldiers, along with most other men of their age, and that not enough of time has elapsed since the war for the usual proportion of them to get into jail. Thus a considerable larger percentage of accomplished and daring habitual criminals are out and at work at any one time in the streets of the country than would be the case if the war had not been. As for this explanation is correct, the wave is likely to recede as the proportion of professional criminals in prison re-establishes itself, as indeed it shows every sign of doing without delay.

### ONTARIO HAS A DEFICIT

Public Accounts for 1919 \$1,559,802 Behind—Has Balance of \$7,000,000.

(Toronto Globe.)

On ordinary accounts Ontario had a deficit of \$1,559,802 for the year ending Oct. 31, 1919. This is the largest deficit in the public accounts tabled in the legislature yesterday. The government presents the accounts this year some time previous to the budget and not with it, as has been the custom in the past. The U. F. O. government is not responsible for the accounts, however, and what defence is made of them will come from the Opposition benches on the opposition side. Considerable discussion is expected. The members meantime will get ample opportunity to study the volume of figures.

The province started the year with a balance of \$5,140,176.35. The payments for the year amounted to \$21,653,274.88. More than \$10,000,000 was secured by treasury bills, but on the other hand loans of \$3,055,488 were retired, as well as the \$4,000,000 in treasury bills. The bank at the present time in the bank is \$7,000,110.15.

### "DOPE" DOCTOR IS UNDER ARREST

"Dr." G. E. White and Wife Had an Office in Toronto.

(Toronto Mail and Empire.)

"I am a doctor and I have if I only could break through the drug habit," declared George E. White of the "Dope" doctor, who was arrested last night by Detective-Sergeants Taylor, Ström, Wickert and White. White is charged with illegally posing as a doctor and fraud, and his wife is charged with fraud. "Office" in Spadina avenue. Though he had been in the city only a week, he had had a long and successful career. The police say the car was sold to him for \$1,200, and that he was using it for his own use. Two other alleged dope peddlers are being held in connection with the case. They were caught in a down town pool room by plainclothesmen Greenlee and Parish, while preparing morphine for sale.
