The British Tories are naturally jubilant over the snap vote which was recorded against the government this week in committee. It is of course an evidence that the government is meeting with difficulties in dealing with its own followers in regard to the Home Rule bill, and it is also true that the radical policies of Lloyd George have frightened some timid Liberals, who fear that the chancellor is going too far from the beaten track.
