SAYS U. S. MUST LEND TO KEEP FOREIGN TRADE

Cleveland, Ohio, Dec. 3.—To sustain our foreign trade under present conditions the United States must provide large scale credits in the form of foreign loans or must invest largely in foreign enterprises, Grosvenor M. Jones, chief of the finance and investment division of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce, told the foreign trade conference of the Cleveland Chamber of Commerce.

"This," he said, "is the natural result of our unique position as a leading creditor nation and at the same time one of the world's chief sources of many important food products and raw materials and many classes of manufactured goods.

"None of the other great creditor nations has been the world's principal source of so many important commodities as the United States is at the present time. This condition may eventually cause serious complications in our fiscal policies, particularly in our foreign trade policies."

New York, Dec. 11 — Strength was not confined to the stock market last week but was also manifest in the bond market, the commodity markets and in foreign exchanges. Evidently then the stock movement was not a mere rally in a reactionary trend, caused largely by short-covering, but a definite move upward based on business conditions.

The last big upward movement terminated because of over-extension and
because earnings had not kept pace
with the volume of business. The reactionary movement which followed
was also carried to excess. Now business volume and the present stockmovements should carry through,, with
the necesary weak spots, to much higher prices.


