Useful Information. ECONOMICAL PAINT.—Skim milk, 2

quarts; fresh slacked lime, 8 ounces; linseed oil, 6 ounces; white Burgundy pitch, 2 ounces; Spanish white, 3 pounds. The lime to be slacked in water, exposed to the air, and mixed in one fourth the milk. Dissolve the pitch in the oil and add a little at a time. Then add the rest of the milk and the Spanish white. A good whitewash for walls is made

by adding to fresh slacked lime and water, a solution of starch, a little salt, and a few drops of dissolved indigo or bluing .- Scientific American.

Paint intended for outside work, which will not be protected by varnish, is mixed as follows: Crush the color if in lumps, and mix to a stiff paste with linseed oil, boiled or raw-the latter is preferable; then, if a dark color, add brown Japan or gold size, in the proportion of 1 pint to a gallon of oil; in a light color, use patent dryer in similar quantities.

Tomato Trellises .- A cheap and convenient trellis for tomatoes is a new era & and over four square frame for every hill.
