THE DREADNOUGHT COST \$8,987,485.

Britain's Latest Battle Ship to Have Enormous Armament, and Turbines. Vessel Will Mount 37 Guns—Will Have Coal Capacity Enabling Her to Steam 5,800 Miles.

LONDON, July 25.—The first official announcement respecting the battle ship Dreadnought is contained in a White Book on naval construction the last year which was issued last night. Besides the ten 12-inch guns announced, the Dreadnought will carry seven 12-inch quick firing anti-torpedo boat guns and five submerged torpedo tubes.

RUSSELL SAGE WILL HAVE A HARD TIME GETTING OUT His Body in a Mahogany Coffin, Encased in a Copper Envelope, and the Whole Placed in a Heavy Steel Shell.

NEW YORK, July 25.—Encased in a hermetically sealed copper envelope placed within a solid mahogany coffin, the body of Russell Sage will today be placed in a chilled steel case four inches thick riveted with steel bolts, locked with a lock that never can be opened and lowered into a grave carted and lined with evergreens on which the clogs will be heaped and around built.
