The reconstruction work on the New Brunswick Southern Railway is being actively carried on. A new steel bridge with a span now crosses the Musquash river at a cost of \$25,000, and at other points along the line bridges of the girder type have replaced the old trestle bridges. Wooden culverts are being replaced with concrete piers. The road is being well ballasted and the construction of a faster train service may be expected.

The work of sinking the fourth crib in the construction of the South-Road wharf extension was completed without a hitch at nine-thirty o'clock last night. The crib was sunk perfectly in line with the rest of the structure and the operation was regarded last night as being eminently successful in the result. The construction of wharf and this, too, will be ready for sinking within the immediate future.

SHERIDAN AGAIN WINS ALL-ROUND CHAMPIONSHIP

NEW YORK, July 5.—Martin J. Sheridan, the giant New York policeman and a member of the Irish-American A. C., the world's best all-round athlete, increased his famous point score of 7,195 to 7,235, in the all-around championship of the Amateur Athletic Union, which was decided at Celtic Park, L. L. today, in conjunction with the annual athletic carnival of the United Scottish Clubs. The big fellow was in excellent form and won nine of the ten events on the all-around programme. His only opponent, Theodore J. Matisko, of the West Side Y. M. C. A., New York, took the tenth and last event, the one mile run, rather easily, as Sheridan eased up, suffering from a stitch in his side. In the pole vault for height, Sheridan distinguished himself by clearing the bar at 10 feet, 5 inches. Matisko did not take part in this event. E. L. Parcel, of Boston, was one of the four entrants for the national honors, but he failed to show up. Emory Payne, of the Mohrman A. C., the Bronx, arrived on the grounds half an hour late and was barred from competition. This left the contest between Sheridan and Matisko.

AMERICANS REGAIN POLO CHAMPIONSHIP

By Winning the Second Game at London.

Six Thousand People Watched the Match—Victors Congratulated by Prince and Princess of Wales.

LONDON, July 6.—The Meadowbrook polo team, composed of Laurence Watkinson, J. M. Watkinson, J. H. P. Whitney and Devereux Milburn, won the second match played here today for the American polo championship. The first game was won by the Americans, June 25, and as the cup was to go to the side winning two of three matches, the visitors, by their victory of today, have secured the trophy for America. The crowd, which numbered close to 6,000, and was composed largely of prominent members of society, watched the game throughout with great interest and heartily cheered the Americans when the final result was proclaimed, and again when the quartette of players who have carried every thing before them since they arrived in England, went up to the royal stand to receive the cup, which has been in England's possession for so many years. During the match, however, there was little enthusiasm, because from the start it was plain that the visitors were far superior to the defenders. The Meadowbrooks scored early in the first half and a crushing blow went up when England evaded matters up by securing a goal with a penalty hit. From that on, the English team never had a chance, three more goals going to the Meadowbrooks in quick succession before the half time. Three more were added soon after play was resumed in the second half, while England got her only other score just before the last interval. This was followed by still another goal for the visitors. The Prince and Princess of Wales heartily congratulated them on their victory. On leaving the royal stand, the Americans were surrounded by enthusiastic commentators who cheered them as they proceeded around the grounds to their dressing rooms. Many American ladies were present, among them being the Duchess of Marlborough, who was the first to offer congratulations. Mr. Whitney and his fellow players naturally were highly pleased at their success. Mr. Whitney declared that it was one of the best games ever played, and while the score was uneven, it was far from a walk-over.

PAT DREEN WINS BURLINGTON MARATHON

Hayes Second, Crooks Third and Black Hawk, a Canadian Indian, Fourth.

BURLINGTON, Vt., July 5.—Pat Dreen, the Boston baker, won a pat distance Marathon race held at Centennial Field here today, in conjunction with the Champlain celebration. Johnny Hayes, of New York, the Shepherd's Bush Olympic winner of 2 years ago, was second, nearly a mile behind. Teddy Crooks, of Fall River, was third, and Black Hawk, Canadian Indian, was fourth. Dreen's time was three hours flat. When Dreen had finished the allotted 26 miles, 385 yards, Hayes just passed his 25th mile. Crooks was in his 23rd mile and Black Hawk finished his 22nd mile. Hayes led during the first half of the race, after which the latter began to fall behind. During the time Dreen was lapped once, Hayes maintained the lead up to the twentieth mile, when his feet weakened and Dreen set out after his lost ground. He recovered his distance in the 22nd mile and then gained persistently, having nearly a mile advantage at the finish. The magnificent weather enabled the managers of the different features to run off the events according to the programme with the exception of the balloon ascension, which was postponed because of a high wind.
