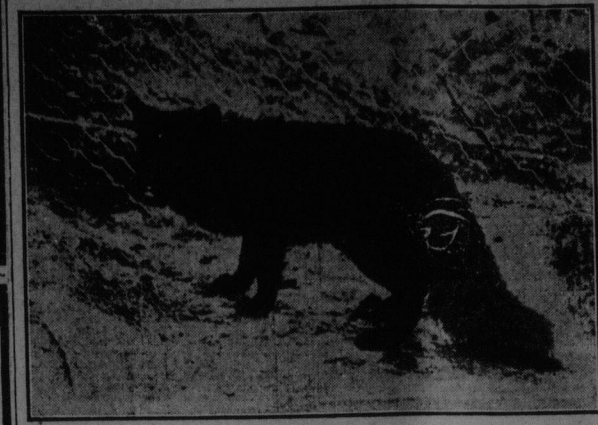

FOXES AT GOLF.

A Montreal exchange furnishes the following amusing fox story—"A member of the Whitlock Golf Club had a rather unusual experience while playing around the other evening. In playing his second shot at the second hole, his ball bounded along close to some shrubbery which lines the side of the fairway, when much to his surprise, as he stood watching his ball, he saw a fox go chasing after it, pick it up, and start playing with it, just as a dog would do with a ball. The player, who was quite a way off, started to yell at the fox in order to scare it away, but the fox only looked up for a moment and then continued to play with the golf ball. Another player was looking for a lost ball in the long grass across the fairway from where the fox was, not more than 50 yards away, and when his attention was drawn to it, he ran towards the fox. The fox did not wait for further orders, but picked up the ball and cleared off into the woods as fast as it could go." Without doubting the veracity of the golfers it is reasonable to surmise the animal was a fox terrier.—Charlottetown Guardian.

FUR FACTS

The silver black fox as it is known today to the trade is a very rare variety of fox found in northern Europe and America. Such is the marvellous lustre and beauty of its fur that for many centuries it has been proudly worn by the nobility of Europe. In recent times the demand for the expensive fur has steadily grown. This is due, largely, to the great increase in wealth, the use of the automobile, the increasing habit of travelling and outdoor life and more effective methods of advertising and salesmanship. While the demand has increased the supply has decreased, until the present high prices have come. There is little prospect of the markets becoming adequately supplied for years to come.

LARGE DIVIDENDS
