Will Load Deals.  
The American schooner Charles  
Wittermore arrived in port yesterday  
ballast. She will load deals here  
for a transatlantic port.

The Leak Stopped.  
The schooner barge Neosho, which  
put in here for repairs to her hull, will  
sail at the first favorable opportunity  
for Norfolk, Virginia, in tow of the  
tug Norfolk. The Neosho, which is  
one of the largest barges of her type  
adorned in North American waters, car-  
ries a cargo of 2,400 tons of kypsum  
(plaster rock).

Schooner Herbert Black Ashore.  
After having received a report of  
her safe arrival at Preston, England,  
Messrs. Nagle & Wigmore were not-  
ified by cable that the schooner Her-  
bert Black had been driven ashore  
during a heavy gale. The Herbert  
Black sailed from this port May 9th,

a term schooner of 594 tons net.
