

to perform, and I invite all my people, and those from the lower Village as well, to do the same.

At another meeting Mr. Pierce said we were to do nothing that the white people did, that they were a bad race of people, and that they did not obey God's law in the least. The only people that obey God's law were themselves.

Connatsee (Edward Sexsmith) a teacher, spoke to the same effect.

At the first meeting (a packed house) so much was said in disparagement of the whites that many of the people were disgusted, and the second meeting was but thinly attended. On my return to Hazleton I was stopped by George Edgar a half-breed teacher who said "Let me tell you that your Crown is no honour to you". Mr. Pierce too at Hazleton told me my Crown was no honour to me.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true.
