The Final Examination shall take place at the end of the Fourth Year. The subjects are; Theory and Practice of Medicine, including Medical Pathology, Principles and Practice of Surgery, Midwifery and Diseases of Women and Children, Medical Jurisprudence, Sanitary Science.

In order that a Candidate may pass in either of these Examinations he must obtain 33 per cent. of the marks assigned to each paper and 50 per cent. of the total marks of the Examination. Candidates who satisfy the Examiners will be arranged in three classes in order of merit, the standard for the 1st and 2nd class respectively being 70 and 60 per cent of the total marks of the Examination.

Medals and Certificates of Honor.—Candidates who obtain the first and second places in the subjects of the Primary and Final Examinations shall be awarded a Gold and Silver Medal respectively, provided they pass both these Examinations at the same time, and Candidates who are placed in the first-class in either Examination shall be awarded Certificates of Honor.

The Primary and Final Examination may be taken together at the end of the fourth year.
