Long Service Medal

Twenty-five years agoon Jan. 14, 1933-an Order Council authorized ". . . the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Long Service Medal be instituted and awarded to officers. non-commissioned officers and constables of the RCMP, after not less than 20 years' service in the Force, as laid down in ... regulations which may be amended from time to time by the minister in control of the RCMP...." A requirement is that any recipient of the medal must bear an irreproachable character; the length of service needed to qualify for the award is practically a guarantee that a man make service in the Force his life's work.

By authority of Orders in Council passed in February and March 1954, the Commissioner may now grant the award of a clasp and star to the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Long Service Medal to those members and exmembers of the Force who have already been awarded the medal and who have subsequently completed 25, 30 or 35 vears' service. The Bronze Clasp and Star is for 25 years' service and a member or ex-member is eligible to receive it five years after being awarded the Long Service Medal. The Silver Clasp and Star is for 30 years' service and the Gold Clasp and Star for 35. Other qualifications for all three awards are similar to requirements for the medal itself - satisfactory service and a good character.
