Seven Men in Party of Robbers-Fail to Wreck Baggage

Special to the Daily Nugget. Spokane, Aug. 26.-The westbound Northern Pacific passenger train was held up at Sand Point, Idaho, 65 miles east of Spokane, last night. The robbers, of whom there were seven, forced the engineer to stop the train, after which they uncoupled the baggage car and then compelled the engineer at the point of a revolver to pull up the track about three miles further, where they tried to wreckthe baggage car with dynamite. The explosives failed and the robbers decamped, allowing the engineer to go back to the train with his engine.


