Was an unsuccessful candidate for Halimand in L.A., Can., at g. e., 1863. First returned to Parliament at last g. e. for present seat. A Conservative, and a supporter of Sir J. A. Macdonald. *Stromness, Ont.*

MCCONKEY, THOMAS DAVID, J.P. [*North Simcoe.*]

Descended from a Scottish family that migrated to the North of Irel. some centuries ago. S. of the late Mr. Thomas McConkey, of Innisfil, Co. Simcoe. B. in the Co. of Tyrone, Irel., 29 July, 1815. Ed. in Can. M. Mary, dau. of Benjamin Ross, Esq., of Innisfil. Has been Reeve of Barrie and Warden of the Co. Simcoe. Sat for present seat in L. A., Can., from 1863 until the Union. Was an unsuccessful candidate for same seat at g. e., 1861. Returned by acclamation to House of Commons at last g. e. A Liberal.—*Barrie, Ont.*

MCDONALD, EDMUND MORTIMER. [*Lunenburg.*]

Of Scottish descent. Grandparents emigrated to N. S. from the Highlands of Scot. B. at West River, Pictou, N. S., 29 Sept., 1825. Editor of the *Halifax Citizen* newspaper. Was Registrar of Deeds, Co. Pictou, for a short period; and Queen's Printer, N.S., from Feb., 1860 to June, 1863; and from Nov., 1867 to Feb., 1869, when he resigned the office. First returned to Parlt. at last g. e. for present seat. A Liberal. Was previously opposed to Confederation, but is now satisfied
