XXI. That all petitions for Private or Local Bills, which may from time to time be received by the House, be taken into consideration (without a special reference) by the Committee on Standing Orders, (or such other committee as may be appointed for the purpose,) who shall report in each case whether the provisions of the 62nd and 63rd Rules, with regard to the publication of notice, have been complied with.

Petitions for Private Bills to be reported on by Committee on Standing Orders.

XXIII. That this House will not, in future, refuse to receive Petitions on account of the same being printed, provided there are at least three genuine signatures upon the same printed sheet.

Reception of printed petitions.

XXIII. That no person who shall have been committed by order of this House, to the custody of the Sergeant-at-Arms, be released from such custody until he shall have paid a Fee of One Pound to the Sergeant-at-Arms.
