interested.

16. No Member is entitled to vote upon any question in which he has a direct pecuniary interest, and the vote of any Member so interested will be disallowed.—B. 455. M. 490.

Decorum
in the
House.

17. When the Speaker is putting a question, no Member shall walk out of or across the House, or make any noise or disturbance; and when a Member is speaking, no Member shall interrupt him, except to order, nor pass between him and the chair; and no Member may pass between the chair and the table, nor between the chair and the mace when the mace has been taken off the table by the Serjeant.—B. 405, 406, 421. M. 385.

Attend-
ance of
Members.

18. Every Member is bound to attend the service of the House, unless leave of absence has been given him by the House.—B. 190, 501. M. 228, 233.
