## For city council's committee structure

Mississauga council has been provided with four options for its 1975 committee structure. All provide for citizen input on for

municipal business. The options were drawn up by the city's recently hired director of policy planning, Chris Fleming. The first option is essen-

tially the recommendation of the management-consultant firm of Stevenson and Kellogg that four policyadvisory committees consisting entirely of elected members be established.

The consultants feel that limiting the committees to council members would allow them to concern themselves more with policy review than with the often cumbersome, time-consu-ming details of specific programs which might be better handled at the staff level.




