Dear Sir,-

Re: Ontario Road Expenditures

Referring to your letters of the 5th instant and September 20th last, I find that in the past it has been the practice to recoup Road Funds for road expenditure first and any balance remaining was credited to Casual Revenue. The reason for this was that the subsidy was then available for re-expenditure on roads. No objection that I am aware of was ever made to this procedure.

However, now that the point has been raised, I am quite willing that the rebates from the Province be credited to Trust Fund and Vote (or Casual Revenue) in the same proportion as the expenditure was charged thereto. I have directed that the adjustments suggested in your letter be made during the present fiscal year and in future this procedure be applied.

The subsidy payable by the Province is being set up in the Recoverable Ledger to ensure the proper refund being obtained.
