Edmonton, Alberta.	1 June/44	Thursday	Graduation exercises today for graduates of Course No. 101, at which Props were presented by Colonel Eugene Stevens, Officer Commanding the U.S.A.A.F. Air Base. The Honour Student was F/O J. R. Johnston (C.20314), who had an average of 95%. This remustered officer had served twenty months in the R.C.A.F. as a Navigator Instructor. In the evening the Band broadcast its regular weekly program over Station CFRN. The Station Football Team won its inter-Service game against the Navy. S/L G. M. Hamilton (C.3833)(Adm.) from No. 4 TCHQ, inspected the organization and administration of this Station. A few suggestions were made, but the work over all was found to be satisfactory.	
	2 June/44	Friday	The Station Band was in attendance at a Wings Parade at No. 2 A.O.S. this afternoon. Representatives of the Women's Auxiliary made their weekly visit to the Station Hospital. Sickness is at a lower than usual level, there being 22 patients in the hospital, of whom four are from other Stations. Sixteen of our personnel, however, are in other hospitals.	
	3 June/44	Saturday	Through courtesy of Major Fabien, Special Services Branch of the United States Army, a U.S.O. party in the City, headed by the Chinese Actress, Anna May Wong, presented their Show to personnel of the Station in the auditorium at 1100 hours. It was an excellent concert and greatly appreciated by officers and airmen of the Station. The artists remained for lunch in the Officers' Mess following the concert. In the afternoon a number of airmen participated in the first Inter-Service Track and Field Meet of the season, which was sponsored by the Highland Games Association. The weather was unfortunate and some of the events were postponed. No. 4 I.T.S. personnel placed third in the events.	
	4 June/44	Sunday	Holy Communion in the Chaplain's Office, Athabasca Hall, at 0800 hours.	
	5 June/44	Monday	S/L W. G. Hammond (C.1942) A.P.M. from No. 4 TCHQ, and F/L W.B. Holtzbaum (C.6636), D.A.P.M. from No. 3 "M" Depot, were visitors on the Station today on matters of Service Police. S/L J. Webberly (C.6203)(PT & D) from AFHQ, and F/L A. R. Lockhart (C.8458)(C.P.T.O.) from No. 4 TCHQ, visited the Station.
