Uplands, Ontario

29th Dec. 1942.

Freezing rain all day. Flying washed out.

30th Dec. 1942.

Very heavy snowfall today. No flying. Wing Commander A.B. Searle (C785) assumed temporary command of the Station, when Group Captain Sampson proceeded on Special New Year's leave.

31st Dec. 1942.

Clear. No flying because of runway conditions in morning. Flying from 1500 to 1700 hours. New Year's dances were held tonight in the Officers' Mess, in the Sergeants' Mess, and in the Recreation Hall, the latter being attended by the airmen and airwomen of the Station. At 1550 hours, Flying Officer Freese, in Harvard 2591, landed too close behind Harvard 3807, piloted by Flying Officer Loriaux. 2591 collided with 3807 causing slight damage to both aircraft. Both pilots uninjured.
