Negotiations to this end have been proceeding by cable for some time past. "That the great need of additional population for Canada renders ungent the adoption by the Dominion Government of measures towards securing a steady and increasing number of immigrants, and that to this end any existing restrictions which forbid the settling in this country of other than agricultural workers should forthwith be abrogated, and such new regulations adopted as will encourage the migration to Canada of large numbers of all classes of the peoples of those countries whose national characteristics render them likely to be readily assimilated here."
